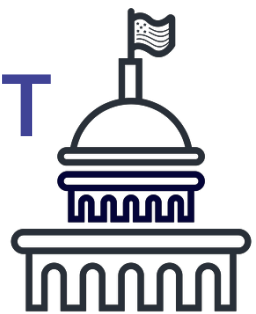
ECONOMIC IMPACT \$5,464,108
